The Trenton, Missouri Region

Located in north central Missouri, midway between Kansas City and Des Moines, Grundy County offers a business-friendly environment with many competitive edges. The county's strategic position along an eastwest Union Pacific rail line and transcontinental north-south Interstate 35 provides first-rate access-to-markets. Companies are able to reach business hubs like Chicago, Minneapolis, St. Louis, Milwaukee, Memphis, Indianapolis, and Cincinnati within a day's drive. This important advantage combined with the low costs of doing business, an educational system which features a variety of degrees and training programs, and excess utility capacity make the region a perfect option for relocating, expanding, or starting any business.

Industries like Food Processing and Agriculture, Automotive, and Transportation and Distribution place a particularly high value on the advantages and resources that Grundy County provides. The State of Missouri ranks in the top 10 states for the value of its agricultural raw materials as well as automotive and vehicle production. The Transportation and Distribution industry alone has grown by 50% in the county over the last five years.

Why Missouri...

- Missouri is financially stable. It has had a AAA bond rating for 50+ years.
- In Missouri, taxes do not eat up all of your company's profits. Missouri ranks in the top 10 states on a number of tax rankings:
 - #5 for corporate tax rank
 - #6 for newly established, laborintensive manufacturing firms
 - #6 for mature, labor-intensive manufacturing firms
 - **#7** for both unemployment insurance tax rank and property tax rank

- Missouri leads the nation as the only state that allows companies to annually select from either threefactor (property, payroll and sales) or single-factor (sales only) income tax apportionment. As of Sept 2016, Missouri is the only state to offer this strategic advantage for manufacturing and service companies.
- Missouri is centrally located in the U.S. and has been ranked number 9 out of all 50 states for infrastructure by the Site Selection Group.

Highway

The City of Trenton is distinctively located at the intersection of State Highway 6 and U.S. Highway 65, both of which have two-lanes. U.S. Interstate 35 is also 30 miles west of the county, and U.S. Highway 36 (fourlanes) is 20 miles south.

Rail

The county offers access to rail services and is located on a Union Pacific rail line which has two spurs in the City of Trenton.

Education

Grundy County stakeholders and employers have long praised the area's educational institutions as one of the region's greatest economic assets. The quality of learning and enrichment opportunities available to the local youth and adults are innovative, customizable, and top-ranking.

QUALITY OF LIFE

Crowder State Park

Located on 1,912 acres in the sprawling green hills of Missouri, the park combines scenic views with recreational activities like hiking, biking, backpacking, equestrian trails, fishing, boating, and camping.

Jamesport

The City of Jamesport is Missouri's largest Amish settlement. Located just outside of Trenton, it's history, shops, and activities make it a great tourist destination.



Grundy County Museum

The museum facilities include Baker School, a fully restored one-room school house, the Annex Building and the Main Museum Building. The main building includes three floors of items and displays reflecting the community and the accomplishments of its citizens.



Healthcare

Wright Memorial Hospital opened a new, state-of-theart facility in 2011 and is a part of Saint Luke's Health System of Kansas Clty. The 25-bed full-service hospital features 24-hour emergency services, four primary care clinics in the region, surgical services, outpatient specialty clinics, and outpatient imaging services, such as MRI, CT, 3-D ultrasound, and 3-D mammography.
